1. INTERESTED IN STUDY ABROAD

- Attend a Study Abroad 101 session in the Global Learning Opportunities Office – sign up by calling (208) 426-2630, visiting SMASH RM. 227, or emailing studyabroad@boisestate.edu
- Complete the Pre-advising Survey (will be sent after your 101 session)
- Set up an appointment with your School of Public Service advisor to figure out what courses you have left to graduate and how study abroad fits in
- Call (208) 426-2630 to set up an advising appointment with a study abroad advisor

2. PREPARING TO GO

- Apply for your chosen program
- Complete all program paperwork
- Read all terms and agreements for study abroad
- Apply for a Passport (if needed)

3. ONCE YOU'RE APPROVED/ACCEPTED

- Pick up Study Abroad Student Handbook & GLO forms
- Turn in all forms
- Check Visa requirements for your host country
- Attend Pre-departure Orientation

4. ONCE YOU'VE RETURNED (OPTIONAL)

- Attend the “Marketing Study Abroad: Unpacking your Experience” workshop
- Apply for the Bronco Buddies Program
- Submit photos to the Photo Contest
- Volunteer at the Study Abroad Fair
