



**Public Lands Internship

**SUMMARY OF POSITION**

The Idaho Conservation League 2020 Public Lands Intern will research land and water conservation issues, draft science-based comments on proposed land management projects and participate in efforts to build support for conservation and public lands in Idaho.

**DUTIES**

- **Public Lands Management:** Review land management project proposals from the Forest Service and BLM and draft science based comments.
- **Field Work:** Join ICL staff on field tours to review mining, travel planning, and forest restoration projects. Assist with citizen scientist and wilderness stewardship field trips as needed.
- **Outreach:** Assist engagement staff with outreach events as needed to elevate ICL's presence within a broad community.

**POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES**

**Skills needed:**

Strong analytical, writing and organization skills required. Background or degree seekers in natural resources, environmental science and/or public policy helpful.

**What you will learn:**

The overall goal of the ICL internship program is to provide real-world conservation experience to college students, graduate students, recent graduates or others interested in learning more about conservation issues. The intern will develop an in-depth perspective of statewide conservation issues and natural resource policies and gain an appreciation for the many roles within a non-profit organization.

**Hours:**

The internship is approximately 10 weeks in length, from June to August, for 25 hours per week. Although the schedule is flexible, it will include some weekends and evenings. This position is based out of the Boise office and will likely incorporate a virtual dynamic.
