

As a student who has successfully completed at least one semester in a regionally accredited associate degree program, you can begin taking a few classes to get a head start on your bachelor's in nursing degree.

Whether you choose to dual enroll, or wait until you complete the RN program and sit for NCLEX, your degree requirements remain the same. It is important to note that due to licensure requirements; you should not expect to be able to graduate any sooner than at least two-three semesters (based on course availability and licensure) following your graduation from your ADN program.

First, you will need to check with us regarding your ADN program of interest. While we can accept credits from most places, there are a few that do not meet the accreditation guidelines. You will be required to complete all general education requirements, so a transcript review is encouraged.

**RN-BS Required Courses** - The courses in **yellow** are those eligible for dual enrollment. The remaining courses are not eligible for enrollment until you show proof of an unencumbered RN-license.
